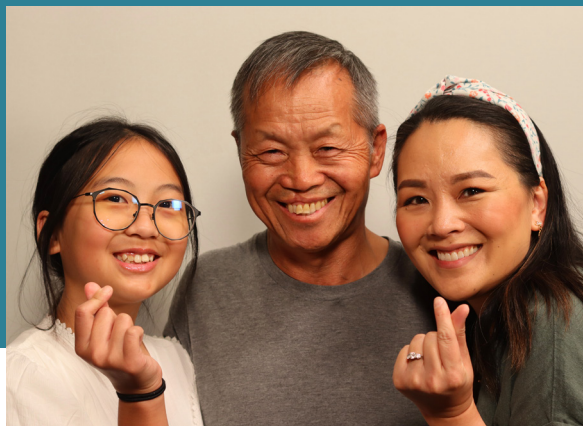




# ABOUT OUR INITIATIVES

StoryCorps initiatives collect, highlight, and celebrate the stories of communities across the United States. Our initiatives help us to ensure that our archive reflects diverse voices from communities throughout the country. All StoryCorps interviews recorded through an initiative are archived at the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress, and many are also sent to other major national institutions.



## GRIOT

Griot is an initiative created to record the experiences of those who identify as African American or of African descent. All interviews recorded as part of the Griot Initiative will be archived at the Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture. Participants who identify as African American or of African descent are invited to participate in Griot.

All Historias interviews are housed at the Benson Collection at the University of Texas at Austin, a specialized research center focusing on Latine people in the United States. The goal of the Memory Loss Initiative is to support and encourage people with memory loss to share their stories, and to create a legacy of recorded stories for people with memory loss and their families. Individuals experiencing a form of memory loss are invited to participate.

The Military Voices Initiative records, preserves, and shares the stories of military veterans, service members, and their families. We invite participation from those who served or are currently serving in any branch of the United States Armed Forces, and their families.

### **SEPTEMBER 11TH (9/11) INITIATIVE**

The 9/11 Initiative honors people affected by the events of September 11, 2001 and February 26, 1993. All interviews recorded as part of the 9/11 Initiative are also transferred to the September 11 Memorial and Museum in New York. We invite surviving family members, friends, and co-workers to record memories of their loved ones. We also record the stories of survivors, emergency personnel, witnesses, disaster relief workers, and of anyone otherwise impacted by September 11th.

### **STORYCORPS OUTLOUD**

StoryCorps OutLoud celebrates and preserve the diverse stories of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer communities. OutLoud invites people of all sexual and gender identities to speak about what matters most to them. We honor the stories of those who lived before the 1969 Stonewall uprisings, celebrate the lives of LGBTQ+ youth, and amplify the voices of those most often excluded from the historical record.

### **AMERICAN PATHWAYS: ANWAR COLLECTION OF MUSLIM VOICES & TAPESTRY OF VOICES**

Anwar Collection of Muslim Voices is an initiative to record, preserve, and share the stories and experiences of Muslims living in the United States. Tapestry of Voices is a special collection that includes participants who identify as immigrants, refugees and asylees. Participants who identify as either group are invited to participate in either or both of these initiatives.
